

You can access Blackboard Learn at UAFS in the following ways:

1. Log into <http://my.uafs.edu>
2. Click the Students tab or the Faculty tab.
3. Click the Log into Blackboard Learn link, on the "I would like to" channel.

Class Collaborate is a service that allows you, your classmates, and your instructor to communicate in real time via video, audio, and shared content (files, screens, etc.)

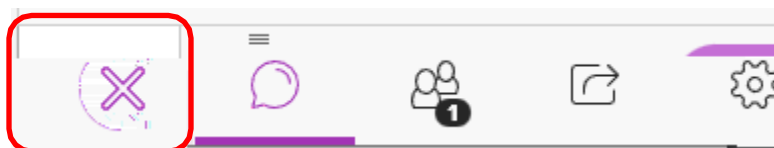
To access Collaborate from your PC:

1. Click the [Class Collaborate](#) link on the Course Menu.
2. Click the [Class Collaborate](#) you need to attend.
3. A sidebar will open on the right side of the page. Click Join session.
4. Make sure your [audio](#) and [video](#) are on in the session.

You can access chat in the session from the [Class Collaborate](#) on the bottom right.





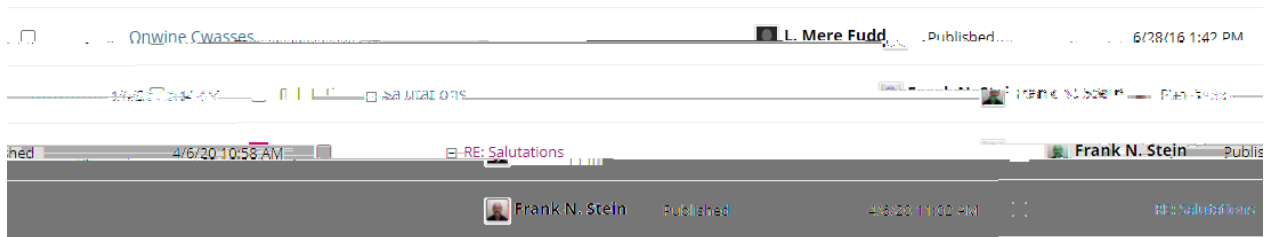
We advise that you do the following when taking tests in Blackboard:

- x Find a \_\_\_\_\_, private space, free from \_\_\_\_\_.
- x Use a computer with a \_\_\_\_\_ connection to the Internet. Wi-Fi connections can be inconsistent at times.
- x \_\_\_\_\_ all unnecessary applications on your computer.

- x If testing with a \_\_\_\_\_, like Examity, make sure the testing space is free of clutter and other potentially suspicious content (mobile devices, notes, books, etc.)

Discussions allow you to post messages at any time of day and respond to your instructor's and your fellow students' posts that they left earlier.

You can include several different types of content in a discussion post, including images, math equations, and embedded video and audio (from YouTube and Panopto).

Discussion messages are organized in threads. A thread is made of an initial message and all of the responses to it. As participants respond to the original message \_\_\_\_\_ the other responses, the thread grows in size.
